### BOIL WATER NOTICE

BELLEAIR, FL – The Town of Belleair Water Department issued a town wide precautionary boil water notice for all Belleair customers until rescinded.

The precautionary boil water notice has been issued due to a recent water main break and will be in effect until satisfactory analytical results confirm that the water is safe to drink. The Town of Belleair will continue collecting samples for analysis until the absence of contamination is confirmed. Customers will be notified when the precautionary boil water notice is rescinded.

Once satisfactory water quality is restored, please run cold water through all plumbing fixtures for several minutes until water is clear. Residents are also advised to shut off ice makers and dispose of any ice made during the affected period.

Residents are advised to boil all water used for drinking, cooking, making ice, brushing teeth, or washing dishes. A rolling boil of one to three minutes is sufficient. All necessary steps are being taken to restore the safety of the drinking water. Microbes, if present in the water, can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches or other symptoms. They may pose a special health risk for infants, young children, some of the elderly and people with severely compromised immune systems.
