Garage, Lawn, and Auto Sales

Ordinance No. 451

Sec. 74-33. Temporary uses in residential districts.

For the purpose of regulating temporary uses in residential districts such as estate sales, garage sales, lawn sales and sale of used automobiles, the following requirements are set forth:

- (1) A permit shall be issued by the Town Manager or the Manager's designee consistent with Chapter 66, Article IV. If the permit applicant is not the property owner, the written consent of the property owner shall accompany the permit application.
- (2) Except as provided herein, a permit shall be issued no more than once annually for each property parcel (not each residential unit if a multifamily dwelling property); and for periods not to exceed the following:
 - a. Garage or lawn sale: Two days
 - b. Estate sale: Seven days
 - c. Personal auto sale: Fourteen days in a calendar year
- (3) Used automobiles shall be owned by the resident of the property on which the sale is being conducted, and shall have an unexpired registration.
- (4) Notwithstanding the once per year limitation in subsection (2), the Town Manager may grant an exception for a second sale within a year if conducted in connection with a property owner's move and not otherwise violating the provisions hereof.
- (5) The Town shall provide approved signs for permitted sales which shall be posted on the property at all times during the conduct of such sales. The sign shall be placed on the property in accordance with Section 74-572(b), Permitted Temporary Signs.

Additional Notes:

- (1) If applicant is not the property owner; then a written consent document is required to include the property owner's printed and signed name, home address, and both home and cellular telephone numbers.
- (2) Four hours of activity constitutes a sale. Residents will be granted an additional day (rain day) only if inclement weather occurs and the sale has been held for less than four hours.
- (3) Applicant must apply for a new permit for any additional day(s) (rain days) within one week from the date of the activity.
